Estabrook/Coleman Place Civic League General Meeting – Nov. 21, 2017

The monthly meeting was called to order at 7:03 PM by President Susan Tweed and Grace Strid led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and gave the invocation. The recognition of guests followed. There were 25 in attendance. Our CRO F.E. Trojhan, from the Third Patrol Division reported the crime stats for the last 30 days and he informed us of an increase in package theft in cars and at home. Questions and concerns followed.

Speakers – Ms. Adele Martin from the Slover Library Foundation gave a slide presentation with history of the library as well as what is available to the public on its six floors. The new regional library will celebrate their 3-year opening in January. They hold free classes on local history and genealogy and also partner with NPS, Va. Arts Festival and Friends of Norfolk Public Library to name a few. She left us some brochures. A Q & A session followed.

Mr. Brian Wilson, an Environmental Specialist with the Dept. of Utilities, explained the FOG Program that came into existence in 2012 as a result of too many sanitary sewer overflows caused by high production kitchens in restaurants in the city. LIVING green

Do you know what **FOG** stands for? Members of the combined Eastabrook and Coleman Place Civic League learned its meaning at the November 21, 2017 meeting. **FOG** is the acronym for fat, oil and grease. These are three things that should NEVER go down the kitchen sink drain. According to City of Norfolk Environmental Specialist Brian Wilson, these items tend to congeal in drainage pipes when they meet cooler water, especially in winter. This leads to costly plumbing clogs for the home-

owner or the City of Norfolk. Rather, absorb cooking grease with paper towels and put it in the garbage instead of dumping it down the drain. Also, those handy "flushable" sanitary wipes are another no-no. Oh sure, they flush down the toilet, but they don't dissolve in the water system like bathroom tissue does. They're another cause of pipeline clogs. Instead, throw them in the trash. One more thing, make sure your bathroom and kitchen sinks have good drain filters, either screen or plastic, to keep chunks of food or hair from getting into the water system.
