Be Safe – Summer Heat is No Day at the Beach

Summer temperatures in Virginia normally climb into the upper 90's and even reach over 100 degrees at times. People can suffer ill health effects when their body temperature control system is on overload. A person's body temperature can shoot up when normal sweating cannot cool it quickly enough in extreme heat. Damage to the brain or other vital organs can result from very high body temperatures.

Summer sun can also present a health challenge. Recent research indicates that among Virginia adults, the number of deaths from and new cases of melanoma, the most dangerous type of skin cancer, have increased even as more adults report using sunscreen. This suggests that some people may not take proper measures to protect themselves from skin cancer. While you enjoy the outdoors this summer, **remember to use sunscreen, seek shade, and wear sunglasses, a hat, and sun-protective clothing.** Use a sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor, SPF, of 15 or higher. As sunscreen wears off, reapply if you stay out in the sun for more than 2 hours and after you swim or do things that make you sweat.

Remember that drinking plenty of water is your best defense against dehydration, heat stroke, and heat exhaustion.

Recycling Drop-Off Centers

The City of Norfolk offers two recycling drop-off facilities for Norfolk residents. These sites are open 24 hours a day, seven days a week and accepts the same items for recycling that are accepted in the <u>curbside collection program</u>.

Electronics Recycling Services

As of April 14, 2023, electronic waste (e-waste) is no longer accepted at Towing and Recovery, 1188-A Lance Road. Norfolk residents must take all e-waste to the Norfolk SPSA Transfer Station located at 3136 Woodland Avenue, free of charge. Residents can drop off e-waste at the transfer station on Tuesdays & Saturdays, noon - 4:00 PM. E-waste must be delivered in a personal vehicle. There is an e-waste disposal limit of five items per visit. Commercial e-waste is not accepted. View a <u>list of acceptable items (PDF)</u>.

Yard Waste

- Yard waste is collected on the same day as regular trash collection.
- Yard waste must be in clear plastic bags or properly cut, tied, and bundled (four (4) feet in length).
- Up to twenty (20) clear bags, weighing no more than forty-five (45) pounds or twenty (20) bundles of yard waste (not to exceed three (3) cubic feet) is accepted per collection.
- Yard waste limbs and branches must be six (6) inches in diameter or less for collection and tied into bundles that are no longer than four feet long and no larger than eighteen (18) inches in diameter.
- Yard waste must not be contaminated with other debris.
- Lawn services and contractors are responsible for removing yard waste generated.
