Estabrook/Coleman Place Civic League General Meeting – January 16, 2018

President Susan Tweed opened the meeting at 7 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and the Lord's Prayer. She noted that Police Chief Boone, scheduled to speak, was unable to attend. New civic league members introduced themselves.

Officer Trojhan gave the crime stats for the month. The 3rd Precinct has two courtesy parking spaces in front of the building for two-party financial transactions such as purchases made on Craig's List. He said up to six hours of radar are being run daily on Jersey Ave. and Chesapeake Blvd. to address the speeding problem.

Councilwoman Mamie Johnson spoke on Norfolk's current commercial picture including: the Sam's Club closing (Norfolk Works program will help Sam's Club workers find jobs), Ikea will open in 2019, the city is studying the idea of Dollar General on the vacant lot at Chesapeake Blvd. and Robin Hood Rd. and asked us to phone or email her, a Planning Commission meeting the end of February regarding the Greater Norview/Five Points project "Imagine Five Points. She also noted other upcoming projects including the flooding in the Coleman Place area (the elementary school) and repurposing vacant buildings (Sam's Club).

Treasurer Bill Jackson gave a rundown of the income and expenses for the last month and noting a balance of \$5,420.25 in the Treasury.

President Tweed reminded us of the civic league website, estabrookcivicleague.org, and welcomed all to the Sunday afternoon crafts gathering from 2-4 p.m. at the civic league building. She thanked all who helped decorate the building for Christmas, notable Carolyn Foca and Janis Carney. Next month's speaker will be a representative from Sweetland's Heating and Cooling.

50/50 Drawing – Councilwoman Mamie Johnson won and donated her winnings back to the civic league.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

Estabrook/Coleman Place Civic League General Meeting – Feb. 20, 2018

Vice-President Carolyn Foca, in President Susan Tweed's absence, called the monthly meeting to order at 7 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and the Lord's Prayer. 25 were in attendance.

CRO Trojhan gave the crime stats for the month. He noted that they are still working on the speeding issue.

Mr. Skip Krepcik, HVAC Head at the TCC campus in Portsmouth and the owner from Sweetland's Heating & Cooling gave a slide presentation on how we can be a better consumer with our HVAC needs. He gave us a checklist of how to make our home more energy efficient and what we can do to prevent heat and A/C loss in our home. Q & A period followed.

Four gentlemen representing the Par5 Development Group that included their lawyer presented to the civic league their intentions of applying for a zoning change to the Planning Commission for the property located at 3350 Chesapeake Blvd., the former Valero Gas Station, to build a Dollar General store. They gave a slide presentation that included a picture of the proposed store and a drawing showing the store's location on the property, parking, dumpster locations and street entrances. It is currently zoned only for a gas station and convenience store. The Planning Commission meeting is scheduled for Thursday, Feb. 22, 2018. There was a lot of discussion from the membership, for and against this change, during the meeting.

Mr Delk Koolman, who replaced Mr. Jim Herbst as our Neighborhood Specialist, introduced himself and gave some information on his background. Mr. Herbst will be the Programs Manager with Neighbors Building Neighborhoods. He noted that a Live Asset Mapping Demonstration will be held at the civic league building on Monday, Feb. 26, 2016 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. and invited civic league members to attend. A Q & A session followed.

Theresa Russell, the newly elected Treasurer, gave the report of last month's income and expenses noting a balance of \$5,965.32 in the Treasury.

Fred Gallup has the raffle books available for purchase, \$10/book. Tickets are \$1.00 each. The drawing will be held at the June 19th meeting for 1st Place-\$100.00, 2nd Place - \$50 and 3rd Place - \$25

Announcements were made. 50/50 Drawing - Ken Carney won and he gave his winnings back to the civic league.

Dragonflies: Mother Nature's Mosquito Control by Suzy Fischer

Dragonflies consume 10 percent to 15 percent of their own weight per day on insects such as mosquitoes, termites, deerflies, blackflies, horseflies and midges, with more than 90 percent of their diet consisting of mosquitoes.

To create a dragonfly habitat, you will need some sort of a water element such as a pond or basin. The water needs to be clean and oxygenated, so you'll need a small pump to add some movement to the water. Keep it small, you don't want a lot of movement.

Dragonflies are sun lovers and the water source should be located in the sun to provide warmth. Add plants such as water lilies to provide shelter, inhibit algae growth, and provide an area where adults mate: submerged plants provide a home for the larva; and erect plants allow a way out of the water when the larva becomes an adult.

To jump start your habitat, take a few spadesful of soil from a pond that you know has an existing population. You will most likely bring home both mosquito and dragonfly eggs and larvae, but that's OK. You need the mosquitoes to feed the dragonflies. Do not add fish. They eat the eggs and larva.
