CRO F.E. Trojhan, from the Third Patrol Division, reported that crime had been down significantly and he gave the crime stats from the previous 30 days. Questions and concerns were taken.

Old Business

Diana Lionetti updated us on the recent Wine Bottle Decorating event. Seven attended. The c.l. made \$140. Carolyn Foca updated us on the Neighborhood Expo at Military Circle that we participated in. Jeanine Lindberg – thanked all who participated in the recent Adopt-A-Spot cleanup. Fred Gallup – raffle tickets will be ready to purchase at the Oct. meeting.

The president reminded us of our yard sale on Sat. Sept. 30th and told us that V.Pres. Carolyn Foca will preside at the October meeting in her absence.

Guest Speaker – Norfolk Sheriff Joe Baron – Their budget is \$42M for this year, they have 500 employees, an audit that he requested in February is complete and will go to City Council. A surprise inspection was held by the Dept. of Corrections and they got a 100%. They also have a volunteer reading program for 1-3 grades. A Senior Seminar sponsored by the department will be Oct.10 at Scope. He is on the ballot for Sheriff in the November election. A Q&A session followed.

Treasurer Bill Jackson gave the report (3 months) of income and expenses.

Fred Gallup presented both Dr. Tatum, principal of Coleman Pl. School, and PE Teacher Allison Makovec each with a \$100 check for school supplies.

The president asked to continue with our donations during the year for our community projects: The Foodbank and school supplies for Sherwood Forest Elem. and Coleman Pl. Elem. School. Announcements were made. Hot dogs and drinks will be provided by Fred Gallup at the Yard Sale.

50/50 Drawing – Janis Carney won and gave her winnings to the civic league. Carolyn Foca won the door prize.

KNOW YOUR ZONE

Check out the new zone evacuation map from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management www.vaemergency.gov. You can also learn how to prepare and prevent loss; creating an emergency supply kit; and information about past VA hurricanes. It looks like we are in Zone C or D. The zones allow emergency managers to communicate with citizens who are most at risk as a storm approaches. In case of an emergency, emergency managers at the state and local level will work with local media and use social media and other tools to notify residents of impacted zones what they should do to stay safe. Depending on the emergency, being safe might mean staying at home, a short trip to higher ground, or traveling to a different region of the state.

GREEN NOTE - General Guidelines

Household trash, recycling, bulk waste, yard waste and tires are all collected at the curb.

Items may be taken to the curb beginning at 5 p.m. the day before collection and no later than 7 a.m. the day of collection. Place carts six feet from vehicles, poles and other obstructions. Cart lids should be closed.

Place carts so that the bar faces the street and wheels face the residence. Empty containers should be removed as soon as possible, but no later than 11:30 p.m. on the day of collection.

Container must be stored 5 feet behind the building line or screened from view.

Trash is collected every week and recycling every other week. Learn your collection date.

Bulk waste must be called in to 757-664-6510, submitted via email at www.norfolk.gov the day prior to collection.

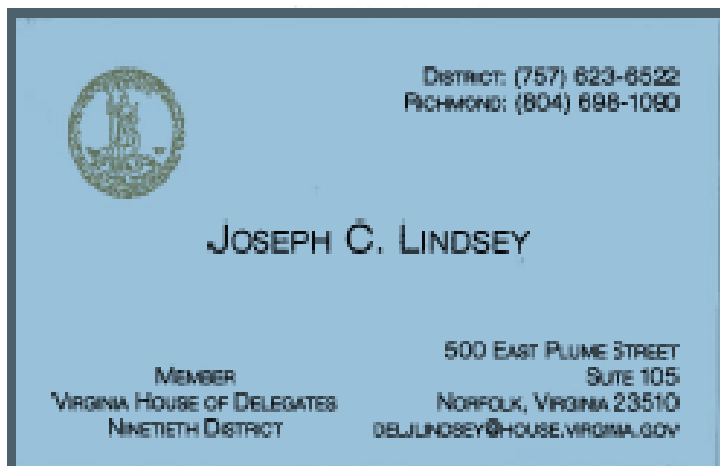
