
## President's Message

He gave an in depth presentation of the importance of serving on jury duty, how citizens are selected, how long they must be available to serve, how to register and how hard it is to get jurors to appear for trials because of no-shows where a few aspects of the process he discussed. A Law Library opened in the court house this year for the staff and public. A Q&A period followed.

Our Treasurer Theresa Russell gave the report of income and expenses for July and August. She noted a balance of \$6,438.83.

The Norfolk Public Library (NPL) offers equal opportunity access to information, high quality book and multimedia materials, programs, exhibits, online resources and technology to meet the needs of our diverse community for lifelong learning, cultural enrichment, and intellectual stimulation. To fulfill its mission, the Library employs a knowledgeable, well-trained staff committed to excel-

lent service and civility. The NPL became the first free public library in Virginia in 1904, and its collection includes classic and popular items from the late 19th century to today. NPL offers access to information, books, programs, and online resources to meet the needs of our diverse community for life-long learning. The library system consists of one main library, ten branch libraries, one anchor branch library, and the Bookmobile. All NPL library programs are free and open to the public. NPL offers special services such as, a Family Place that offers free programs that focus on developing skills essential to literacy. A local history and genealogy collection, is located at the Slover Library and can be accessed online, and a selective depository library for government documents.

A little history..NEIGHBORHOODS: NORFOLK 1955 ANNEXATION excerpted from norfolk.gov



By 1950, the Norfolk area was the ninth fastest growing metropolitan area in the United States. The Norfolk County area from Ingleside through Norview to North Chesapeake Bld was annexed. Including the 1959 annexation, the size of the city grew to 64.3 square miles, of which 53.6 are land, and 10.7 which are of water. Once WWII had ended, an intense demand for housing of military members and their families

erupted. The Veterans Administration made it easy for them to purchase homes which builders, in turn, responded by flooding the market with small detached homes meant to fit a certain price range, often less than \$7,000.

Stability is the best word to describe Estabrook's past. Developed in the 1920s as almost a country settlement in Norfolk county, Estabrook's only connection with the downtown area revolved around a trolley line that ran along Chesapeake Blvd., between the City of Norfolk and Ocean View. Containing a history of helpful residents who resided along quiet streets where no two houses were the same, the two or three bedroom homes in here were built to last.





#### The Law on Code Enforcement

Code enforcement uses a variety of tools in an effort to achieve compliance. Education is just one tool that we use to work with property owners to address a violation. We will work with owners and provide a timeline to resolve the issue and to improve the quality of life in your neighborhood.

#### **Common Environmental & Nuisance Violations**

Inoperable Vehicles - Vehicles which cannot operate on public streets
Illegal Parking - Parking vehicles on unimproved surfaces of the front, corner

side yard or buffer yard of a lot in a residential district

Overgrown Grass - Weeds and grass tall or taller than 12 inches

Trash Containers - All trash containers must be stored five feet behind the front plane of the building Renting - No more than four (non-related) renters at a single family home

Solid Waste - All property shall be free of solid waste, trash and debris
