CHESAPEAKE BAY FOUNDATION LIVING SHORELINES IN HAMPTON ROADS

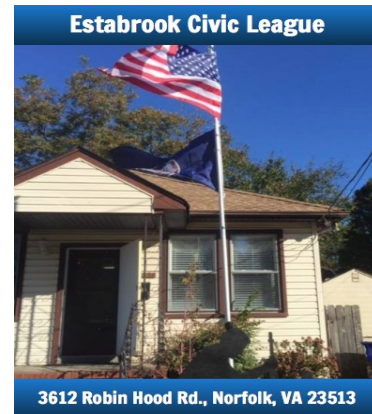
Living shorelines are areas along the edges of waterfront property that have been deliberately enhanced with oyster shells and marsh grasses to attract wildlife. Living shorelines also help stabilize shorelines and reduce erosion. Any waterfront property owner in Hampton Roads can consider living shorelines. They're fun, easy to create, and help improve water quality in streams, rivers and the Chesapeake Bay.

Native oyster restoration is an ongoing effort in Hampton Roads waterways, and providing additional shell habitat is critical for success. A typical living shoreline requires 80 bushels of oyster shell.

An additional feature of living shorelines includes planting marsh grasses along the shoreline. These native plants provide wildlife habitat and food, help stabilize the shoreline, absorb flood water and storm surges, and reduce nutrient pollution running off the land. A joint agency permit must be obtained before any shell is placed; CBF will assist property owners in the permit process. CBF transports oyster shells to the site in the early summer months, when the oysters in Virginia waters are entering their reproductive season. CBF pays for the cost of the shell and its transport through grants. For more information, contact CBF's Hampton Roads office at (757) 622-1964 or hamptonroads@cbf.org

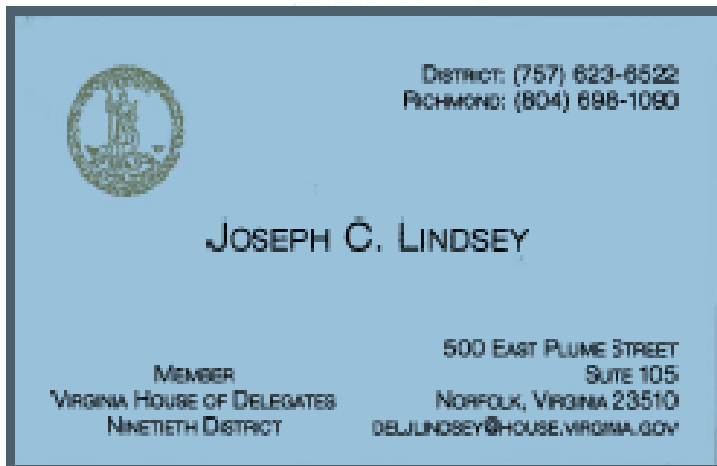

Update About the Community from Jim Herbst, *Senior Neighborhood Development Specialist*

Zoning. George Homewood, Director of Planning, presented a proposed timeline to Council Tuesday for bringing the Zoning Ordinance Rewrite process to a close. For this citywide rewrite of the 1992 zoning ordinance, they have attended over 100 meetings, made 23 presentations to outside groups, and had over 350 individuals attend the outreach meetings. A schedule of formal public hearings mandated by state law will be forthcoming, and the final vote is planned for January. The suggested path for 5 Points has been to loosen the land use restrictions and keep some of the development standards affecting Sewells Point Road in the rewrite. Garbage Can Plan. Since January, we have pursued the suggestion to place a few garbage receptacles on Sewells Point Road that could be decorated by neighborhood youth. We were making arrangements to do this over the summer with youth from the community center. The garbage receptacles that were available to us, however, were repurposed 55 gallon drums. We viewed similar receptacles used in public parks and discussed with representatives of the business association. While suitable for a park like setting, the business representatives and I determined that they did not rise to the standard that we would like to begin setting for the business corridor. The bottoms also rust out. We are working with Keep Norfolk Beautiful and Waste Management to price three or so garbage receptacles similar to downtown and the NEON Arts District.

Drive Thru Art Gallery. Hopefully you have seen the positive coverage in the Virginian Pilot and AltDaily regarding the drive thru art gallery project. Submissions are arriving and more are anticipated by the September 1 deadline. Most property owners have confirmed their participation. The 5 Points Public Art Committee will review the submissions, most likely the first week in September. They will also discuss and make more concrete plans for a "Gallery Opening" event in October. We did not want to set a date until we have a sufficient number of quality submissions and until we are confident they can be printed on vinyl and mounted by whatever date the committee chooses. In other words, we don't want to set a date and not be ready for it.

Development. I spoke with the owner of the BP recently who still intends to redevelop the vacant warehouse/theater building as soon as the zoning process is completed. The new owners of 1136 Hugo have gutted and rehabbed the property. They are making interior improvements to the 1140 Hugo property. Economic Development and Planning staff continue to urge interested investors to bring serious plans to them. They are aware of 5 Points' unique obstacles and will do their best to steer around them. Economic Development is also working on a workforce development program for the area to connect residents with jobs.
