Elizabeth River Trail

For a great bike ride try the Elizabeth River Trail which stretches 10.5 miles along Norfolk's iconic waterfront. The ride starts at Norfolk State University, the Harbor Park portion of the trail skirts around the impressive Harbor Park Stadium - home to the Norfolk Tides, before continuing down to the waterfront. The Downtown Waterfront section is comprised of some of Norfolk's most-loved treasures. Waterside Marina, Town Point Park, and the Nauticus all reside along this portion of the trail. Stretching from Wisconsin Square to across the Brambleton Bridge, the Freemason section offers a tour of one of Norfolk's oldest and architecturally stunning neighborhoods. The Sentara Loop is a detour route that crosses the Hague and traverses the Mowbray Arch section of Ghent. It aligns back with the original trail at the corner of Redgate Avenue and Orapax Street, before continuing into West Ghent. The Fort Norfolk portion of the trail passes by the historic Fort Norfolk - the last remaining harbor-front fort authorized by George Washington in 1794. It also encompasses local favorite Plum Point Park. This portion of the trail weaves through the Chelsea neighborhood, home to an eclectic mix of restaurants, breweries, and businesses. The West Ghent section is a scenic route that encompasses the Redgate Avenue pines, Lamberts Creek, and Jeff Robertson Park. It also follows multiple Norfolk Southern railroad lines. Lambert's Point stretch of the trail starts with the bustle of Hampton Boulevard, but quickly transforms into a quiet trip through residential neighborhoods. The ODU section stretches the entire Old Dominion University campus - from Powhatan Fields to the Perry Library, past the student center and up to Foreman Field. The Larchmont-Edgewater section bisects these two neighborhoods on a picturesque trail that follows along the waters of Edgewater Haven and passing Myrtle Park. The longest portion of the trail, the Lochhaven section boasts beautiful residential streets, views of the Norfolk Country Club marina, and the Hermitage Museum and Gardens. Hurricanes are giant, spiraling tropical storms that can pack wind speeds of over 160 miles an hour and unleash more than 2.4 trillion gallons of rain a day. Being prepared and having what you need is essential to limiting a hurricane's impact on you and your family.

- Know whether or not you live in a hurricane evacuation area and know the best route. If you
 are unable to evacuate by yourself or with the help of friends or family, register with
 the Special Needs Registry online. This can be found on the Norfolk.gov website.
- Secure your home from damaging winds, including having pre-cut plywood for your windows and an easy way of securing them.
- Communicate with family during and after the impact of a storm. Keep in mind telephone lines and cell phone systems may have limited access or may be overwhelmed and jammed up with callers, so have an out-of-town contact person for each member of your family to checkin with.
- Know the emergency plans for your workplace and your children's school; these plans may help you develop your own plan. Secure your pets and animals; make sure you have extra supplies and a plan for them regarding evacuation and sheltering.

GREEN NOTE by Jeanine Lindberg

Estabrook and Coleman Place homeowners have worked extra hard in this summer's heat and rain to keep their lawns mown and tidy. Your neighbors appreciate those efforts to make the neighborhood look great, especially if you properly disposed of the grass clippings. Sweeping or blowing the clippings onto the sidewalk or into the street can be dangerous for pedestrians, bicycles and motorcycles as well as being illegal. Clippings that are blown into the gutter or street can be carried by rainwater into storm drains. This may lead to clogged pipes and costly repairs. If the unfiltered clippings get discharged into a waterway, they may easily promote toxic algae growth. (Norfolk Code 41.1-

4 ...prohibits pollution of the storm water system... and leads to a \$2500/day fine or 12 months in jail.)

Sidewalks littered with grass clippings can be slick for pedestrians, especially when it's newly mown and still damp. Riding across clippings on the street is like driving on ice for bicylcles and motorcycles. The easiest solution is to set your lawn mower on "mulch" which sends the clippings back onto the grass where it acts as fertilizer. Or, you can do it the old fashioned way by sweeping up the clippings and putting them into a clear plastic bag to set out on collection day with your other yard waste.


TALL GRASS AND WEEDS ON YOUR STREET?




